You alone are my strength, my shield To You alone may my spirit yield You alone are my heart's desire And I long to worship You

I want You more than gold or silver Only You can satisfy You alone are the real joy giver And the apple of my eye

You're my friend and You're my brother Even though you are a King I love You more than any other So much more than anything

When I heard it, I was excited because here was a song that said what I felt in my heart and soul. It is based from Psalm 42

- 1 As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God.
- 2 My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?

This song explained the thirst and hunger I had for God, both then and now. Let me explain: I need time alone, in prayer, with God. Just like we all do. Life gets busy, we put so many responsibilities on our plates, and we go, go, go! The first thing that usually drops is our alone time with God. We say to ourselves that we will simply move that time to night before bed (and of course, we are too tired!) The psalmist knew the longing and knew what it was for quality time in the presence of God. Times of prayer, times of worship, times of study and times of silence.

We make time with God a priority in our life once again.

Report of 2023 Virginia Annual Conference

I attended the 2023 Virginia Annual Conference June 15-17 at the Berglund Center in Roanoke. The theme was "United as One in Mission" with Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson as the officiating bishop. The conference theme was based on Acts 1:8b, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (NIV)

Opening Worship

Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson preached on "Going Beyond the Walls of the City." She reflected on the pressures in the world in light of Covid, war, and more as it creates exhaustion for individuals and the Church.

She said as followers of Jesus, it is our job to follow him outside the walls, where he waits for us. She reminded the body that Jesus is waiting outside the walls for us to join him. "If you want to find Jesus don't look in your churches, don't look inside the walls, go out to those who are suffering and burdened and you will find him there."

Conference Business

Reports were received from the various Conference offices, Boards and committees.

Thirteen churches were closed including two in the Shenandoah River District:

- Concord (Stuart) UMC, Mountain View District
- Leesville UMC, Mountain View District
- Watson Memorial UMC, Mountain View District
- Ashburn Korean UMC, Northern Virginia District
- Cedar Grove UMC, Shenandoah River District
- Saint Mark's UMC, Shenandoah River District

Two new faith communities were announced: Provision Church, Northern Virginia District, and St. Andrew's UMC, Three Notch'd District, will launch a Korean language faith community as a sister congregation.

Warren Harper and Rev. Lindsey Baynham Freeman, Co-chairs, General Conference Virginia Delegation, and Mark Elder, Lay Delegate to General Conference reported on the events that this delegation has worked with over the past few years since their election in 2019. Mr. Elder presented a plan that will be before the 2024 General Conference called "The Christmas Covenant Regionalization Plan". This plan has been unanimously supported by the Virginia Delegation. The Virginia Annual Conference voted to affirm that the General Conference should support legislation to create regionalization for the future of The United Methodist Church.

Service of Remembrance

Seventy-five conference clergy and laity who died since the last Annual Conference were remembered.

The Rev. Gary Miller, retired associate member, Coastal Virginia District, preached for the Service of Remembrance with the sermon "Can These Bones Live" based on Ezekiel 37: 1-14. He reflected that the prophet Ezekiel was set in a valley of dried bones. Just like him, we might look around at our lives, at our churches, and wonder can the bones of our lives and these institutions have new life?

He said in closing "It is time to rise. It's time for us to get up. It's time for us to know we can have life. It's time to celebrate who we are. God is not through with us yet. God has a mighty work for us to do as a people."

Retirement Service Fifty-eight persons were part of the 2023 Retirement Class. These individuals have a combined total of 1,210.25 years of service.

Disaffiliation and Wrap-up stats

The Chairperson of the conference Trustees reported that since October 2022, the 107 churches have disaffiliated under Paragraph 2553 of the Book of Discipline. For these churches, the legal closing process had been completed for 70. The remaining 37 churches were to be completed in the weeks following Annual Conference. Once the process for these 107 churches is completed, the total consideration paid to the conference will be \$8.46 million.

The final called session to consider disaffiliating churches under Paragraph 2553 in the Virginia Conference will be October 7, 2023. At the time of Annual Conference there were approximately 107 additional churches seeking disaffiliation. Once approved these churches will have 60 days to close the process and leave the United Methodist Church.

David Dommisse, Conference Treasurer and Statistician, projected by year-end the Virginia Conference would stand at 900 churches with 268,000 members and reported the projected effect of disaffiliations would be:

- 6.4% of local church revenues
- 10.7% of apportionments
- 9.3% of membership
- 13.2% of average worship attendance and
- 13.1% of professions of faith

The full impact of disaffiliations will not be fully known until 2025.

The 2024 budget was approved for \$27,362,000, a 1.33 % reduction from the 2023 budget.

Grace sent a total of 70 hygiene kits to Conference. The total number of UMCOR and hygiene kits collected was 14,745. In addition, 3,170 hygiene Kits and 20,000 Rise Against Hunger kits were assembled during Conference. Seventy-three blood products were donated with the Red Cross Blood Drive and approximately 1,000 pounds of food collected for food banks across the Conference.

Over \$95,000 was collected towards the Conference Offering. Grace gave nearly \$200. The offering benefits: Food Insecurity, benefitting food banks around the Commonwealth; Refugee Response which supports ministries engaged in refugee resettlement; and Partnerships of Hope Countries supporting Brazil, Cambodia, Mozambique, Native Americans, Haiti, and Vietnam.

Service for the Ordering of Ministry

One certified lay minister and 23 lay supply pastors were recognized. Sixteen local pastors were licensed, one provisional deacon and 12 provisional elders were commissioned. One associate member was recognized, one individual received recognition of orders and five elders were ordained.
