Missions

Mission Statement of Grace UMC: As we learn about how the different committees in the church lead us in living the church's mission statement, we come to those featured in March and April. In March, our focus is on the Worship Committee, chaired by Jody Osborne. Much of what they do is behind the scenes, so be sure to ask any of the committee members about how they serve Grace. In April, our focus is Lay Leadership. Our Lay Leader is Michelle Cissel. Each featured committee gets to choose the recipient of the communion offering for their month.

Ongoing Missions:



CCAP helps those in our community with food, clothing, and financial assistance, and they strive to help everyone who walk through the door as their resources allow. We have collection bins under the clothes rack for non-perishable foods, etc. For more ways to help CCAP, go to

MAMA Program – This program helps the students at Middletown Elementary School. Their needs vary, but ways we have helped in the past include hats, supplies for the clinic, snacks, school supplies, and paying overdue lunch bills. There is a collection basket that will have what is currently needed listed. **Canned fruits**, boxes of macaroni and cheese, and canned peas are being collected through March 10 for Easter food boxes.

Prayer Shawl Committee – This committee provides prayer shawls to those who need comfort and prayers as well as hats and scarves to several organizations in the community who serve those in need. They are always in need of yarn. Worsted weight or sizes 4 and 5 are the most useful, but they can find a way to use whatever they are given. They have plenty of baby yarn currently.

Bright Futures Frederick/Winchester is currently supporting over 1,500 students in Winchester and Frederick County. We help with food for the backpack program, school supplies, and more as special needs arise. Look for the collection bin. ABBA supports pregnant women, their newborns, and their families with education, resources, and more. There are baby bottles in several locations in the church for spare change.

Our own Thrift Shop – Bargain hunters, those on tight budgets, and the curious love shopping our Thrift Shop. Donations are accepted during open hours, and the Shop's proceeds help the church and the community.

Seasonal Missions:

Details on these missions are on the bulletin board and table at the back of the Fellowship Hall. These are larger mission projects. Help where you can, and your time can be the best donation of all.

Conference Kits are taken to Annual Conference. We are currently collecting items for **Hygiene Kits and Feminine Hygiene Kits**.

Thanksgiving Food Boxes – This collection of non-perishable foods can provide food security and a holiday meal to those relying on food pantries. 
Finances At a Glance

Below is a summary of Grace Church's finances for 2023. Total undesignated offerings received to the General Fund increased 10.1% over 2022 while church expenses were unchanged from 2022 expenses. Many thanks for your financial support of the church and the various ministries during 2023.

Unfortunately, having to cancel services two Sundays in January due to snow and ice has not gotten 2024 off to a great start financially. Expenses exceeded revenue by \$2,002 (16.8%). While this may be a temporary decrease in funds, please pray about and give as you are led by the Holy Spirit.
